

NEW SMYRNA BEACH, FLA. OFFERS INCREDIBLE VIEWS OF NASA'S ARTEMIS 1 LAUNCH

New Smyrna Beach, Fla. (August 17, 2022) – Tens of thousands of onlookers are expected to view NASA''s first launch attempt for Artemis 1, scheduled for the morning of Monday, August 29th. Located about 30 miles from the launch site at Kennedy Space Center, New Smyrna Beach is an ideal location for watching the historic maiden voyage of the moon rocket launch. New Smyrna Beach's beautiful beaches and Intracoastal waterways will offer breathtaking vistas of the exciting launch that will be felt and heard throughout the region. Visitors may also enjoy magnificent views of the launch from many of the area's oceanfront condos and hotels that are facing south. Artemis 1 will be the first integrated test of NASA's deep space exploration system at Kennedy Space Center. The uncrewed flight test is projected to travel 280,000 miles from Earth on a three-week mission that will place the Orion spacecraft in orbit around the Moon before returning to Earth. The mission will serve as a keystone test for NASA's future crewed Artemis missions. Backup dates for the launch are Friday, September 2, and Monday, September 5 (Labor Day).

Extend the rocket launch fun by enjoying some of the many delicious dining spots and outdoor activities that await in New Smyrna Beach. A favorite of locals and visitors for outdoor dining, live music, delicious food and hand crafted cocktails is Flagler Tavern, located on Flagler Avenue, just steps away from the shoreline. Visitors may also experience New Smyrna Beach's scenic beauty by enjoying some of the incredible outdoor activities, such as renting a kayak and exploring the diverse blueways that twist through the entire area.

The New Smyrna Beach area includes the communities of New Smyrna Beach, Edgewater, Oak Hill, Osteen and Port Orange in east Central Florida. It occupies a notable place in history as the second oldest city in Florida, site of the largest single attempt at British colonization in the new world.
